A Message from Board President Adrian Bennett

Thank you for your ongoing support this giving season. This year is one marked by continuations, pivoting, and merging for the DCHS, all pursued with a view towards enhancing, revitalizing, and expanding our mission to preserve, promote and celebrate our shared local history.

The Antique Fair, the Historical Haunt Walks of Downtown Bend, and of course the Chili Feed are continuations of marked success. We have pivoted by partnering with C3 Events to bring Bend Night Markets onto our grounds every Friday throughout the summer, as well as continued to work with, among others, the Old Mill District, the Bend Chamber of Commerce, and the Oregon Archaeology Road Show.

We have merged our enterprise with the Deschutes Pioneers' Association which disbanded in 2022. The DCHS has brought the former Pioneer members into the membership of the DCHS and assumed responsibility for the Pioneer Queen as well as the Pioneer Scholarship for high school seniors. In the latter category we have renamed the scholarship to honor the primary Pioneer Association promoter of the program to the Leon Devereaux Historical Society Scholarship and opened the applicant field to include high school seniors from beyond the Deschutes County lines, to include Crook and Jefferson counties. The scholarship is underwritten for now by the funds raised by the Pioneers, but it will need additional financial support to be sustainable in the long run.

Of course, our exhibits have changed to include the highly popular Klunkers and Stumpjumpers exhibit about the origins and development of mountain biking in our own backyard, a celebration of the Deschutes County Library's *A Novel Idea*, and a return of the John Fremont photo exhibit of several years ago. We are still working on locating a site and funding for the History Pub as well as with ODOT regarding the plans for a permanent exhibit on the evolution of irrigation, agriculture, transportation, and industry within the county.

All these activities require money, and it is only with your support that the DCHS can pursue them with any assurance of success. 





Remembering Bonnie Bernice Burns (1942-2023)

Long time Deschutes Historical Museum volunteer Bonnie Burns passed away November 20, 2023. The space she leaves behind at the museum is large. There isn't a part of the museum that she hasn't had an effect on. Bonnie was always ready, willing, and able to do whatever needed to be done. For those reasons and more she was honored with Volunteer of the Year in 2009.

When she wasn't greeting visitors at the front desk with her smile, she was on the third floor as an expert investigator uncovering the

secrets of an inquiry or artifact. Bonnie's skills at sleuthing helped unearth the story behind Tot Taggert Pringle being buried in the wrong grave.

Often her detection turned into a bigger story which she'd write for the museum's newsletter, *The Homesteader*, or the *Bend Bulletin*. That is where she shined, weaving the tale of a person's life, or a simple found object into an amazing piece of storytelling.

Not even the pandemic stopped her from being a part of the place she loved. Bonnie still researched and wrote, even if it was from home. Earlier this year, she figured out the year and persons captured in a 1965 Bend Water Pageant photograph, and posted it on the museum's Facebook,

To Bonnie the museum wasn't just a space to spend time in, it was a place of community and friendships. To those working with her at the museum Bonnie gave her whole self- her stories, her laughter, her humor, and her heart. She brought joy to all of us here and we will miss her deeply.

Updates from the DCHS Pioneer Committee: The Future of the Pioneer Queen and Scholarship

As many of you know, in 2022 the Deschutes Pioneers' Association (DPA) voted to decommission itself this year and merge its affairs with the DCHS. Since the DPA provided the foundation for the museum, the decision was enthusiastically but sadly accepted by the DCHS.

The DCHS assumed responsibility for both the Pioneer Queen selection process and the DPA Scholarship program. The 2023 Pioneer Queen is Charleen McKee, and a new one will be selected at the DCHS annual meeting in 2024.

The Scholarship program will henceforth to be known as the Leon Deveraux Historical Society Scholarship, renamed in honor of Leon Devereaux's commitment to both the scholarship program and to historic preservation in our community as a former board member for both the DPA and DCHS. Open to high school seniors planning to attend an institution of higher learning, the application will entail submission of an essay which addresses either a historical event (pre-1970) in Central Oregon history or a person or group that was instrumental in some aspects of pre-1970 Central Oregon history. While researching the selected topic, the archives of the DCHS and/or any other archives from nearby collections, e.g., Warm Springs Museum and the Crook County Historical Society must be utilized. The scholarship fund comes from past fundraising efforts by the Deschutes Pioneers' Association, but the program needs to be endowed for it to continue in the future. Contributions earmarked for the Leon Deveraux Historical Scholarship program can be made throughout the year or you may consider an appropriate designation in your will.

Application details will be available in January 2024.
